Opportunities to Meet Your BCC Neighbors

Are you a new BCC homeowner or renter and are wishing you knew who your neighbors are?? Well, those of us who have been here for a while would also be delighted to meet you and welcome you to our great community! There are several ways you can "get your toes wet" here at BCC. Firstly, there is **Thirsty Thursday** which meets weekly from 5:00 – 6:00pm at the clubhouse on Lexington Circle. Just bring your own beverage of choice and a small snack/appetizer to share with the others. Then, once a month there is a **Musical House Concert** at the clubhouse from 2:00 - 5:00pm on a Sunday afternoon. The particular Sunday each month varies depending on the artist's schedule and other BCC events – see the newsletter each month to mark your calendar or watch for an informative email prior to the concert. Bring a \$15.00 donation for the artist and an appetizer to share. And then, in **the Spring and in the Fall there is either a brown bag lunch** (bring your own) or sometimes it is an evening potluck at the clubhouse. In the Summer, you can meet some of your neighbors by signing up for a **garden box in the community garden** where you can grow some vegetables and flowers for your own consumption. Also, there is our swimming pool where you can meet neighbors. The past few years there has been an **August evening event that connects with the National Night Out** program where we gather for a potluck when we have local law



BATTLECREEK COMMONS COMMUNICATOR VOLES MAKE HOLES, MOLES MAKE MOUNDS



That was the first lesson learned when consulting a professional critter controller in early March. If you walk the path next to the City Park, you might have noticed a whole lot of 3" holes in the grass on our side of the walkway this spring. Voles, a cousin to a field mouse, burrows under the grass and leaves openings that are very obvious. The grass on top of the tunnels gets spongy and can fall into the tunnels. There are other places on BCC grounds where vole activity is showing up, so be careful as you walk

across the grass anywhere on the property. No messed up ankles needed!!

Moles (and gophers) are migrating from the park onto BCC grounds as well, obvious from the mounds of dirt they throw up. They will start getting active as the weather warms. Your BCC Board is looking at ways to mitigate the damage these rodents cause and will determine how best to proceed to get ahead of the problem and maybe avoid unsightly vole holes and mole mounds this year.

As we mark the 5-year anniversary of the COVID pandemic, the virus continues to affect some people. So perhaps getting another vaccine shot is a good idea. Semiannually is a good rule of thumb, although advice says it is okay to get an additional shot as close as two months following the last shot. Point of interest: As of mid-March only 23% of adults in the US have received an updated COVID vaccine. (PBS News Hour)

!! Items of the Month !! It is always good to keep track of the expiration dates on your



water and food. These items do need to be cycled back into your household supply and replaced in your emergency kit. Once you've done that, having a "toilet" type item is a great thing to have in your kit. You can just get a 5-gallon bucket, some big plastic bags, and kitty litter to use as an emergency toilet. The rim of such a bucket can be he

"Luggable Loo" with a nice seat and lid attached. These are around \$22 at REI, Dick's Sporting Goods, Camping World, or Cabela's to name a few places. Also, you can actually get just the seat and lid attachment from the same places for around \$16. While you're at it, maybe get two (2) buckets. One for #1 and one for #2!

Recipe Corner!

Lavender Tea Bread

Ingredients

- ¾ cup milk
- 3 tablespoons finely chopped fresh lavender
- 6 tablespoons butter, softened
- 1 cup white sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 ½ teaspoons baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt

Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 325 degrees F. Grease and flour a 9x5 inch loaf pan.
- 2. Combine the milk and lavender in a small saucepan over medium heat. Heat to a simmer, then remove from heat, and allow to cool slightly.
- 3. In a medium bowl, cream together the butter and sugar until smooth. Beat in the egg until the mixture is light and fluffy. Add lemon juice. Combine the flour, baking powder, and salt; stir into the creamed mixture alternately with the milk and lavender until just blended. Pour into the prepared pan.
- 4. Bake for 50 minutes in the preheated oven, or until a wooden pick inserted into the crown of the loaf comes out clean. Cool in the pan on a wire rack. Try it with fresh strawberries slices on top.
